
EDUCATION (continued)

ESU & FHTC TUITION VOUCHER*

- Provide \$1,000 each year, \$500 per semester, to help offset education costs to high school seniors currently residing in Coffey, Lyon or Osage Counties, who will graduate in the current academic year and attend either Emporia State University (ESU) or Flint Hills Technical College (FHTC) in the fall immediately following graduation.
- Students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours and degree-seeking.
- All payments are made directly to the institution.

*ESU and FHTC identify eligible students upon admission and administer this program for The Jones Foundation. NO application is required.



Jones Foundation provides financial assistance for payment of various services to children under age 21, provided they are US Citizens and current residents who have continuously resided in Coffey, Lyon or Osage Counties for no less than one year immediately prior to making application. The services outlined below are merely a representation of the type of requests considered. Some restrictions may apply as not all services are covered.

GENERAL MEDICAL

- hospital (inpatient & outpatient)
- physician services related to specific illnesses
- mental health
- prescriptions (in conjunction with approved medical services)
- associated costs for Type 1 Diabetes
- special equipment
- therapy services

ORTHODONTICS* (BRACES)

Jones Foundation has contracted with Smiles Change Lives (SCL) to administer its orthodontic program. SCL is responsible for responding to application inquiries, approving requests and coordinating case management throughout the entire orthodontic treatment process. All questions and applications are managed by SCL. *Eligibility requirements differ from all other programs.

VISION

Provided there is no other vision plan or insurance coverage, the cost of an eye exam and up to \$175.00 may be considered for glasses or if currently wearing, contacts. For eye exams, Jones Foundation does not pay co-pays nor balances after insurance and should your vision plan or insurance payment exceed \$175.00 for glasses/contacts, the Foundation will not consider payment of the remaining balance. Jones Foundation must pre-approve all services and typically does not reimburse for any costs paid prior to application.

EDUCATION*

Jones Foundation offers financial assistance for post-secondary education to individuals, regardless of age, who have continuously resided in Coffey, Lyon or Osage Counties for no less than one year immediately before attending a postsecondary institution. To be eligible, the following requirementsmust be met:

- US Citizen or Non-US Citizen in Lawful Permanent Resident (LPR) status
- Current resident of one of the three counties or a dependent of current resident. If dependent, BOTH must satisfy residency as stated above.

*Students moving in to one of the three counties and attend an education institution prior to fulfilling the one-year residency requirement are not eligible. Attendance at an education institution in the three-county area does not alone establish residency.

UNDERGRADUATE EDUCATION GRANTS

- Are need-based grants available to students who are enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours and degree-seeking.
- Are awarded to help offset the cost of tuition, fees and books for attendance at numerous colleges.
- Students must complete a new application each year and can do so for a maximum of eight semesters (fall and spring only).
- All payments are made directly to the institution.

Each year, beginning May 1, applications are available exclusively on our website and are to be returned on or BEFORE June 15.
